Don Piche stated that Eagle Harbor zoning states "no windmills", but the county board has approved the study if the EDC would like to proceed. John Sturos and Don Secor volunteered to head up the Wind Power Study. A lengthy discussion ensued about the cell tower. Peg Kauppi will speak with Gina Nicolas about getting a meeting set up with all the key players to get this issue resolved once and for all.

KC Marketing: Peg Kauppi reported that CHIA advertising has created a new brochure and map which will be distributed soon. The KCVB is soon to launch a new mobile app, which once downloaded to a smart phone is accessible without cell coverage.

Planning Commission: Ned Huwatschek reported that there were 30+ people at the last meeting where verbiage was being decided for Houghton Township's zoning for RS/RR.

Keweenaw County Board of Commissioners: Don Piche reported the county board accepted a bid from B&B Construction for re-siding the courthouse. The job is estimated to cost \$107,000.
